Reader 1:

These articles from ***The Universal Declaration of Human Rights*** provide a context for our prayer:

All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.

Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.

No one shall be held in slavery or servitude; slavery and the slave trade shall be prohibited in all their forms.

No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment of punishment.

-Articles 1,3,4,5

Reader 2: A Reading from the poetry of Mira, a Sufi Mystic, c. 1450 A.D.

The Way They Held Each Other

A woman and her young daughter were destitute
and traveling to another country where they hoped to find

Three men stole them while they were camping.
They were brought to a city and sold as slaves
each to a different owner.

They were given one minute more together,
